

I am either going to Iowa State for animal science or being a carpenter



The 7th Grade Exploratory Art Class made some spooky Halloween character prints. They learned about the printing process, which includes composing your design, then chose Halloween characters from movies as our subject matter. The students drew a variety of scary images including Jack Skellington and Sally, Pennywise, Michael Myers, and Chuckie. After perfecting their drawings, it was time to transfer them onto the foam printing surface. We did this by tracing the drawn images onto the Styrofoam and then removing the paper and retracing the image with ballpoint pens. After our images were complete it was time to print! Students learned how to roll ink out with brayers and onto their foam designs. They got to choose from a variety of colors and even mixed some of their own. The last step was to press the foam onto their paper and roll over it with a clean brayer. Then students could peel the paper off and see their original print. 
CHEER COMPETITION

PUMPKINS! PUMPKINS! PUMPKINS! SCIENCE AND MATH

Tri-County third grade students used pumpkins to learn some science and math in November! Students had 5 different stations they rotated around to complete some hands on math and science activities. Before engaging in each station, students listened as Mrs. Foubert read a few pumpkin stories and pumpkin facts. The students learned all the different parts of a pumpkin, and their favorite fact they learned was that years ago the Native Americans would eat every part of the pumpkin!

During the first day, students measured the height and circumference of their pumpkins after first making predictions of what they thought the pumpkin would measure. Next they used a spring scale to measure the weight of their pumpkin. The pumpkins all weighed over 8 pounds. The students also worked in groups to count how many ribs their pumpkin had.

The last station was a science station where the students predicted if the pumpkin would sink or float. Many of the students were delightfully surprised to see their heavy pumpkins floating! Why do pumpkins float? Pumpkins, although large, aren't very dense because they are mainly hollow inside. Given their large size, though, they displace a large amount of water. With a mainly hollow_interior, it's easy for a_pumpkin to weigh less than the large amount of water it displaces! What a fun hands-on science lesson!

On the second day, the students worked in groups to clean out their pumpkins and then counted the seeds. Almost every pumpkin had over 700 seeds. That's a LOT of counting!! The students were having so much fun with their pumpkins, they didn't even realize how much learning they were doing!
