

## Update on Spanish

We are currently focusing on oral comprehension in Spanish class. For this, different strategies are used:

- 1. Students watch a video (a movie trailer, a commercial or a song) and complete the transcription of the video with some words given.
- 2. Instructions. This week, in pairs, one student read the instructions to draw a monster and the other student drew it.
- 3. Gamification. Such as through the handkerchief game, where a player from each of two teams fight to get a handkerchief that a person is holding in the middle of the playing court. In this case, the vocabulary learned that week is treated, since each player is assigned a number, a body part, a meal, etc.
- 4. Technology. For example, a student asks Alexa about the current date, the weather or a song that he/she wants to listen to.

## High School Students Use New Google Expeditions Equipment

Tri-County received funding from Richard Armstrong to purchase VR/AR equipment for the secondary students at Tri-County. VR stands for virtual reality, in which students wear goggles that shut out the exterior world and s/he only sees what is on the screen. AR is augmented reality, in which digital images are added to a limited area in front of your eyes.

Advanced Biology students used the above equipment to access Google Expeditions, a program that allows students to explore a variety of different topics. Mrs. Krumm guided the activity with a tablet and can monitor that they are following along with the tour by looking for the "smiley faces" on her screen. They used this system to observe different displays of evolution from several museums around the world. This equipment will allow students to access materials they might not be exposed to in real life.

The staff at Tri-County have been working on improving assessment scores by receiving explicit winter instruction from the Great Prairie AEA team and have been trained on mathematical interventions. The school wide focus is on improving student achievement and closing the achievement gaps specifically in the areas of literacy and mathematics. We strive to provide our students with quality instruction and learning in a safe, positive, and caring learning environment.

Students in K-6th are celebrating their growth on the winter FAST assessments by having a pizza party. Students needed to be at benchmark or show growth on the literacy and mathematics assessments.

Interventions for the secondary include reading interventions, mathematical interventions, STEM enrichments, and SEL (social emotional learning). Students are assessed during the testing periods and the secondary leadership team evaluates where each student will be best served. Interventions may include reteaching mathematical skills or functions needed to be successful, reading interventions may include book studies and vocabulary enhancement, SEL interventions may include improving social skills, providing students with creating goals, and enrichments may include technology and science based activities.

Our speech team headed to Districts on Saturday, January 25th to perform at Ottumwa High School. Our speech team consists of forty-two students in grades 9th-12th grade.

Our basketball teams and wrestling teams are demonstrating their Trojan pride on and off the court/mat. We appreciate the continued support of the students, families, and community in attending athletic events.

The pep band has had a booming success with performing at the local games. We appreciate their hard work and dedication displayed.

Let's continue to show our Trojan PRIDE in all our scholastic activities and extracurricular activities. I'm proud to be a TROJAN!


